
Clothing Drive

Paper Cranes for Yuto


"A Japanese legend promises if one were to fold 1000 paper cranes, the recipient would be granted a wish by the Gods". A call went out from NSISP for a former Japanese student from the program. After Yuto had returned home to Japan from Cape Breton, he took ill. After hearing of Yuto and the Japanese legend, our We Act group at HNRH decided they wanted to add to the 250 cranes being sent. Our students made 700 paper cranes to deliver to the NSISP office. They were put with other paper Cranes from various schools in Nova Scotia for a total of 1474 cranes to be delivered to Yuto. What a wonderful act of kindness from our school to be shared with a student over in Japan. Yuto was so surprised and happy to have so many people thinking of him. Last we heard, he was out on a week pass after 4 months. Three of the tumors are gone and the last one is much smaller. He will still have more chemo and radiation but for now is strong and happy, and hoping to be released from hospital in early March. A huge Thank you To all of the students who helped with this paper crane wish for Yuto.

Education and Early Childhood Development

Schools across the province now have a new student attendance and engagement policy to address the growing concern of student absenteeism.

The policy and a supporting operational plan were shared with the education system on September 20th, and took effect October 1st 2017.

The policy is intended to help improve student attendance through a balance of supports, incentives and consequences. The policy is designed to identify and address absenteeism before it becomes a problem for students through early and targeted interventions.
